Travels with the General

"Fall Cruising"

Last month we cruised the Ozarks at the conclusion of the Eureka Springs Corvette Weekend and the 'General' made note of a possible Fall Color loop that we could drive sometime. Several enthusiastic drivers of the 'CACC Roadrunners' convinced me to set up a color trip for Saturday, November 1st but I was out of town & unable to get an email out in time to invite other club members, although I did text several regulars and some of the Fort Smith club. Returning home late Friday, I started the car for the first time in weeks. gave it a guick wash in the dark, and set out early Saturday morning to meet the others at the Hwy 10 Kroger.

Despite cool & windy conditions, we cruised Hwy 10 / 9 to Oppelo and then up Petit Jean Mountain to our first stop at the overlook. Sandy was good enough to capture LJ, Ron, & myself beside our cars & dressed for the conditions....no tops down today!! We visited Mather Lodge next for a picture of the valley & lined the cars up for the visitors and children to inspect. Several vehicles hindered our pace as we glided off the west side of the mountain into Centerville and then up Hwy 7 to Mt. Nebo. It had been a while since we visited this mountain & we had forgotten about the continuous string of switchbacks that provided excitement and drifting practice for the next Smoky's trip. As always, we miss Lee & Diane Woods and several others when we get to enjoy these conditions.

Our planned route was to leave Mt. Nebo & follow Hwy 22 west to Hwy 109 which would get us across the Arkansas River onto Hwy 64 where we would find a luncheon spot before reaching Mulberry. We stopped in Ozark & had a great lunch at the Mexican restaurant on the west end of town. Hwy 215 was identified last month as a nice scenic color route and we would pick that up in Mulberry. For the second time in as many months we

have encountered a problem with the DeLorme Arkansas Atlas which depicts roads in red and uses various line thicknesses for classifications. While searching for new & exciting roads, the General failed to notice the FR notation on a section of Hwy 215 connector and the change to a finer red line...very difficult to discern. This means Farm Road and not paved, so we had to backtrack and surprise the yard workers for a second time. We looped around to the "Pig Trail" and took it north to Cass where we would resume our travels on Hwy 215 along the Mulberry River.

This section of road presented the best color we had seen along this cruise. Roads are well maintained and exciting for our variety of driving. We passed a lot of activity at one location along the Mulberry & later discovered this to be the 'Byrd's Adventure Center' where they cater to floating, 4 wheeling, rock climbing, gliding, fishing, camping & other activities. They have a restaurant & I've inquired about times & menu for

our next trip to this area.

Following the earlier lunch, our plans were to visit the "Oark General Café" again to try their desserts before the trip back home. The pie & ice cream was just what we needed but we didn't expect that there would be a line-up today. Much to our surprise Stan Yates and Lola Self were already there enjoying lunch with another couple. We visited with several patrons and Brian, the owner, before being seated and he promised to check his mail & attach the CACC decal to the front door.

We encourage you to get out for a drive on these exciting roads & visit some of these out-of-the-way places for a meal.

CACC Member, Ken Leslie, brought a guest from Fort Roots, North Little Rock VA Hospital, Michael Dodd. Michael has given 2 tours in combat with 21 years of service. Michael is over the volunteers in 2 hospitals. Volunteers are placed with their skill level. He has 17 places across Arkansas that transports Veterans in VA Vans to our medical center. Drivers (volunteers) put in 18,000 hours/year of their time. Michael stated for material objects, that anything can be donated, i.e., a golf cart to transport veterans from the parking lot. A long list of needs has been given to Ken to distribute to the CACC.

Besides needing drivers, volunteers are needed on the Dementia Unit as a Meal Mate. Meal Mates come in and talk to the patients while they eat. Pet Therapy is on the Dementia Unit with a dog named Ava. Shannon Soenksen, CACC Member, is in charge of providing donations for Ava from club volunteers. Musical Skills are needed to come and play and sing or donate instruments for the residents to have and play. There is a summer youth volunteer program, ages 14-18, June through August, with scholarships available.
